

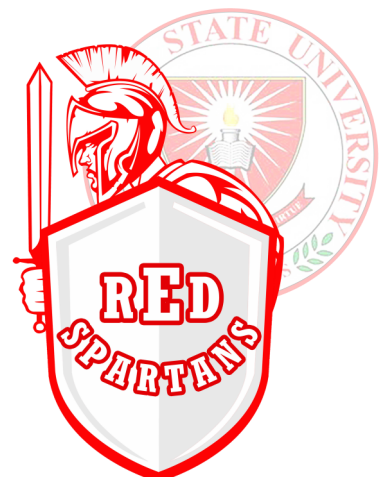

Executive Summary

The **Batangas State University** continued to realize its commitment for service excellence with its administration and constituents who are passionately working hand in hand. Throughout the years, the University has shown continuous progress towards its vision and mission and for the Fiscal Year of 2014, the manifestation of its growth and development has been evident.

Once more, the University gained national recognition when the Mechanical Engineering department was named Top Performing School nationwide in the field of Mechanical Engineering. The department ranked first in the March and October 2014 licensure examinations. The University likewise had (4) four licensure examination topnotchers from various programs: Master Electrician, Chemical Engineering and Customs Brokers. These signify the strong leadership and administrative will that the Administration possesses in order to ensure that the University programs could truly provide the students with the best education they deserve.

Accreditation was strongly pursued in different campuses, with forty-five (45) academic programs, the most number so far in the history of accreditation in the University, subjected to AACUP assessment from March to November in seven (7) of the ten (10) campuses. Of the total of one-hundred twenty (120) programs that the University offers across ten campuses, seventy-six (76) now have been surveyed, accredited and/or re-accredited.

As part of its mandate of providing equal access to BatStateU education, the University opened its doors to 40,507 students from the Main and Extension campuses, and extended scholarships to 9,984 students. These helped them tide other expenses required in their respective disciplines. The University also crafted an Entrance Admission Test to ensure that the best and most qualified student applicants are accepted to the University. The library acquired new titles and added volumes of books to help students engage in more scholarly thinking. Of utmost importance are the opportunities for faculty members to professionally upgrade themselves through study and attendance to fora and conferences.

Research and extension played an important role in the stature of the University. Highlights of the achievements of the Research Unit were international and local paper presentations and conduct of studies aligned to the national, CHED and other funding agencies' research agenda. Likewise the Extension Service Unit designed programs to meet varied needs of the service clientele such as Capability Building Training Program, Technical Assistance and Advisory Services, Community Outreach Services, Communication / Technology Transfer, Utilization and Commercialization Information Services, and Extension PAPs supporting Gender and Development.

The research and extension services gave the service communities the encouragement and empowerment to uplift the quality of their life. To perform such tasks, the Research and Extension Units sustained their collaborative partnerships with other government agencies and worked in partnership to reach more beneficiaries.

Internationalization initiatives with universities in Asian countries were sustained. The faculty and students fostered knowledge-building opportunities for education and research. The 4th batch of Exchange Students Program from South Korea and the continuous visitation of other universities which include Korea, Vietnam and Thailand, marked the widening of the University's doors for international linkages and collaboration.

The University is recognized for its well-managed financial structure particularly its relatively high income from tuition and other fees and revenues generated from various entrepreneurial activities. This is a reflection of sound financial management practices and the act of putting into practice its avowed core values of transparency and accountability. Evidently, the University has crossed the year aware that it would continue to face more challenges. With the unity of all its stakeholders guided by proper vision and the inspiration from Almighty God, the University will continue to attain its societal goals and perform its role as catalyst for change.





Academic Affairs

The Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs is tasked to assist in the formulation of policies, programs and activities pertaining to the efficient management of educational programs as well as in the monitoring and evaluation of the effectiveness of instructional and student-oriented services.

With a total of 891 faculty members delivering quality instruction to more 40,000 students enrolled in ten campuses strategically located throughout Batangas province, the University's high premium on faculty training and development has enabled eight faculty members to earn their doctoral degrees and 26 others to graduate with masteral degrees in their respective areas of specialization. A total of 24 faculty members are currently pursuing graduate studies under the BatStateU Faculty Development and Scholarship Program.

The creation of the Council of Deans and Associate Deans further facilitated initiatives on quality assurance and compliance with program standards set by the Regional Quality Assessment Team of the Commission on Higher Education, the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities of the Philippines, Inc. (AACCUP) and the Philippine Technological Council (PTC). A significant feat was the recognition from AACCUP as the second highest ranking University with 45 academic programs granted accreditation status in FY 2014.

Faculty competence and commitment were evidenced in the remarkable performance of students in licensure examinations which consistently surpassed the national percentage passing registered by the Professional Regulation Commission. Nine faculty members successfully hurdled the stringent requirements for accreditation as ASEAN Engineers. Students likewise excelled in national and international competitions and proudly brought home honor and prestige to the University

Scholarships, library holding, linkages and job opportunities increased in response to the growing need for greater access to quality education and relevant learning experiences. Activities were also conducted to ensure the holistic development of students and inculcate in them the core values of the University.

Significant strides were indeed achieved in FY 2014, all of which are anchored on the University vision of *"A globally recognized institution of higher learning that develops competent and morally upright citizens who are active participants in nation building and responsive to the challenges of the 21st century."*

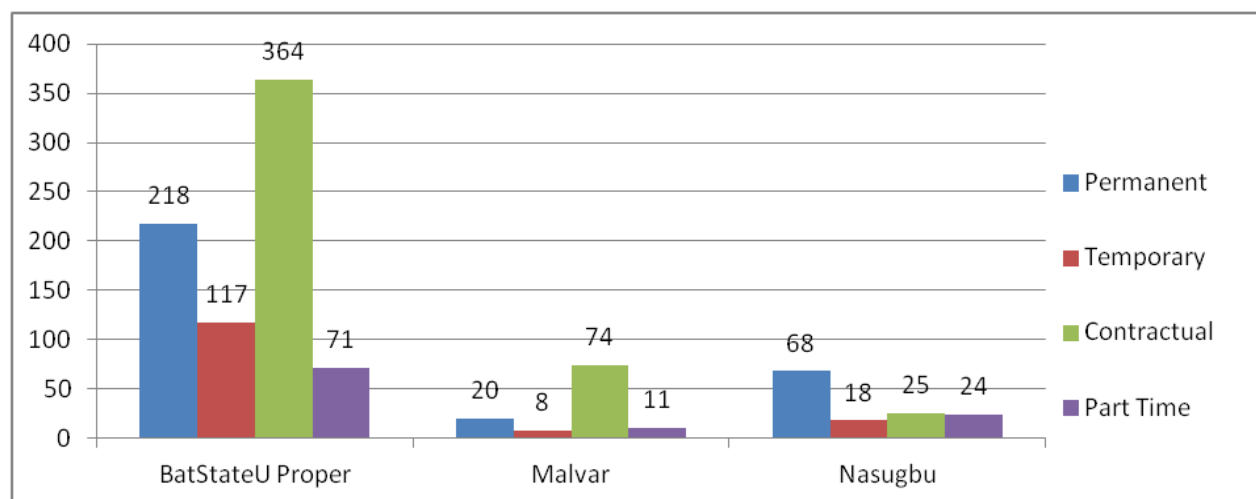

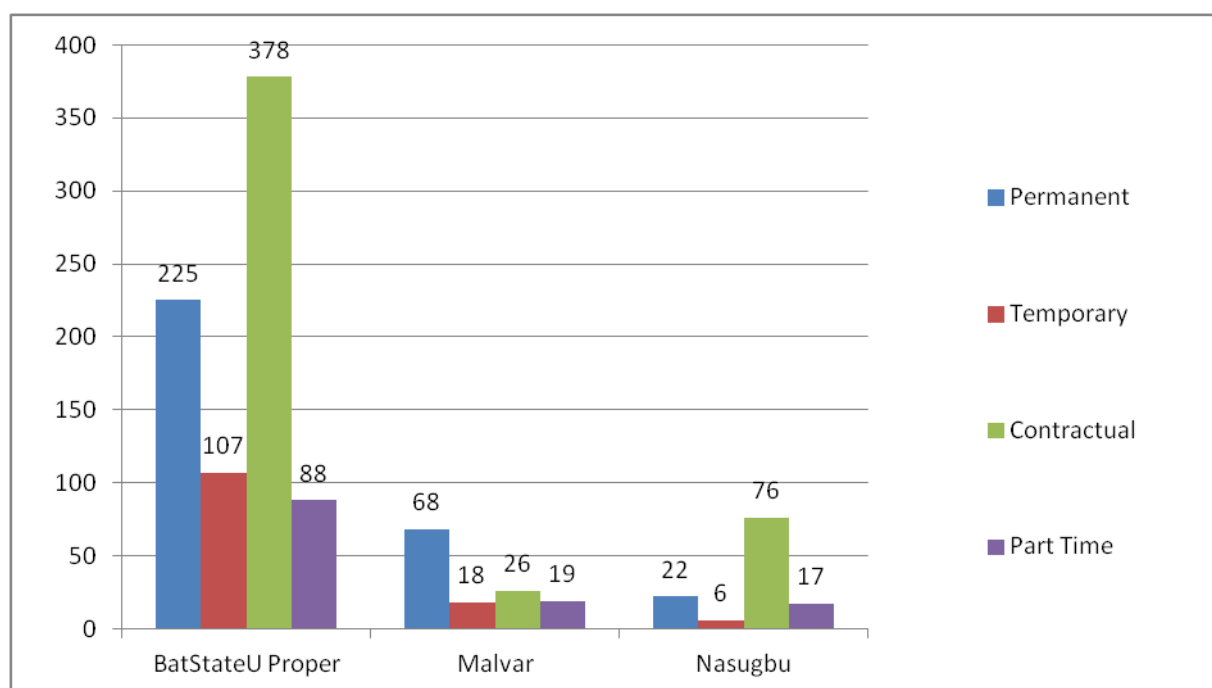
Faculty Distribution According to Status of Appointment – 1st Semester, 2014 - 2015

Faculty Distribution According to Status of Appointment – 2nd Semester, 2014 - 2015



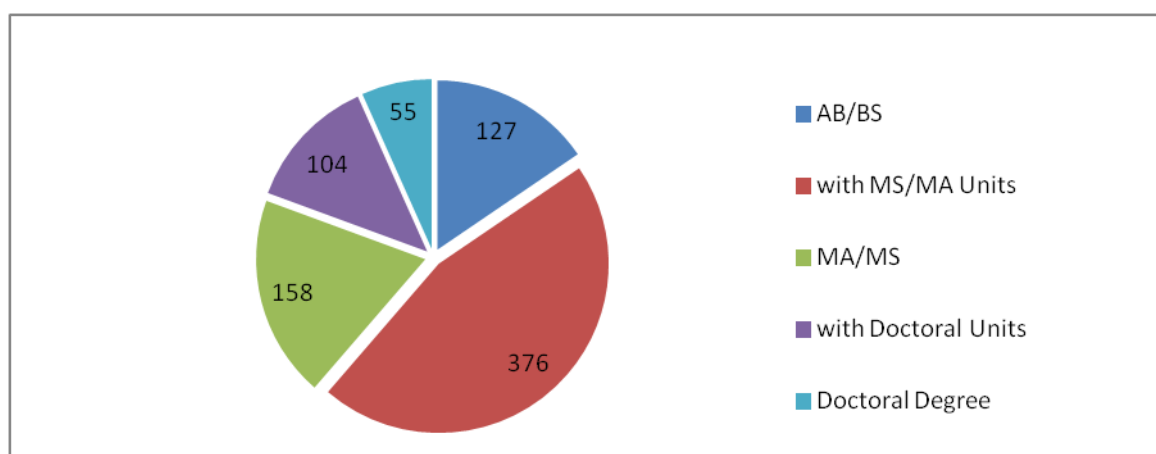
EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

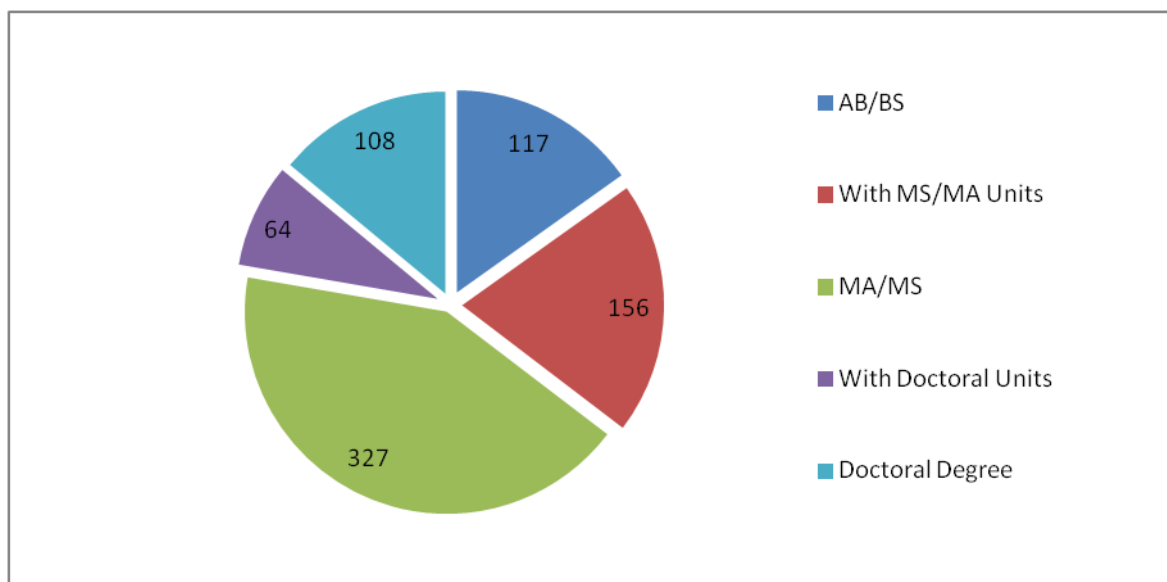
Faculty Distribution According to Educational Attainment for 1st Semester 2014 - 2015

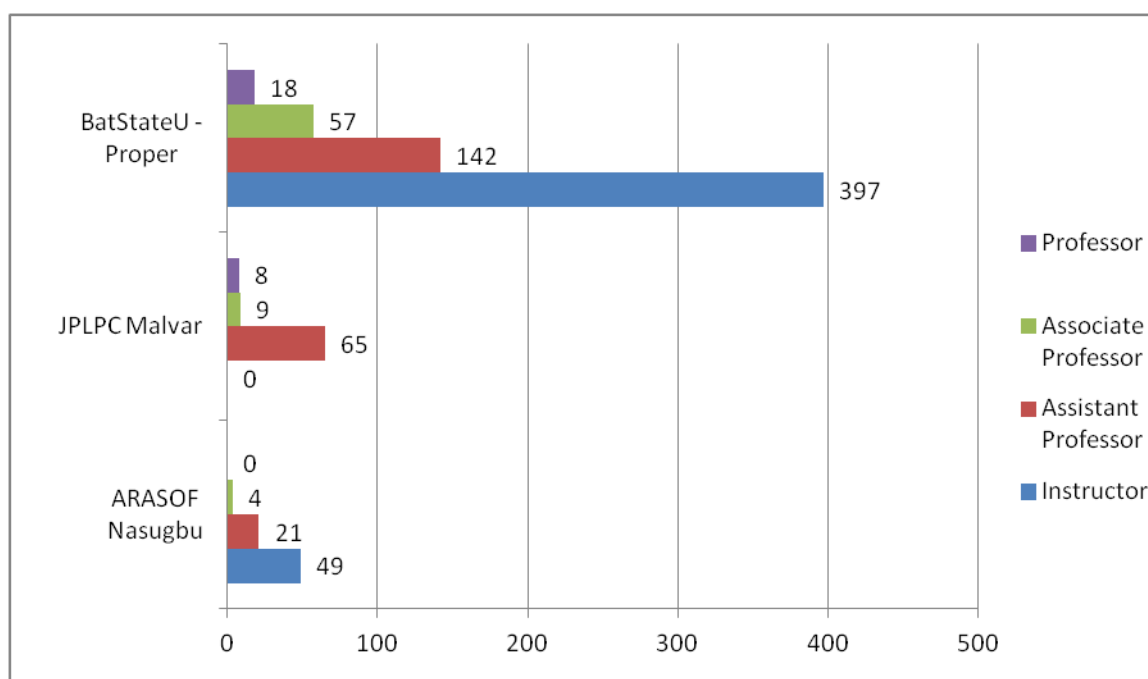

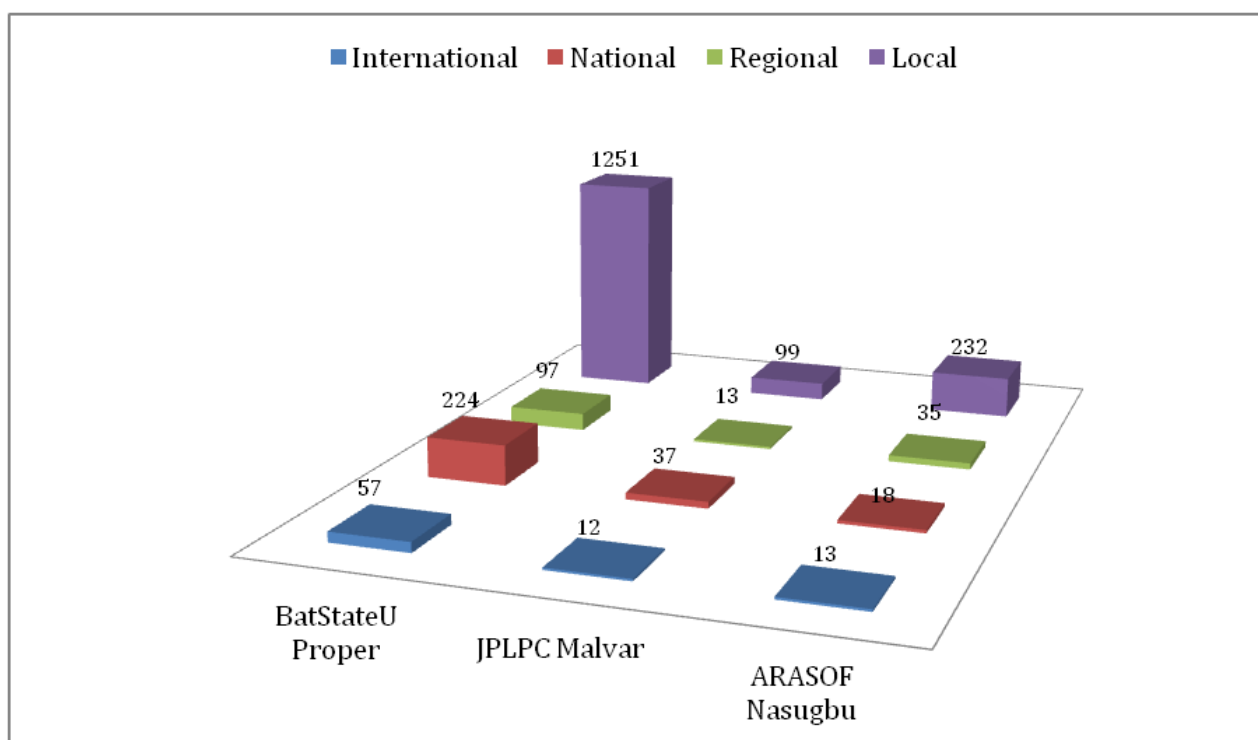

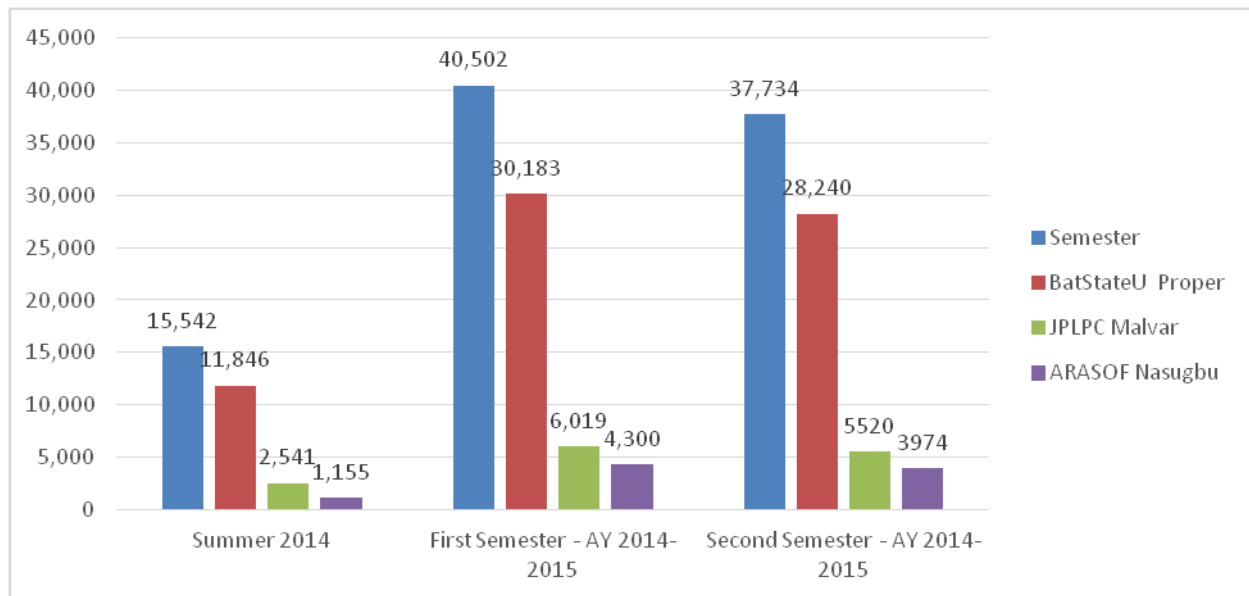

Summary of Enrolment by Semester and Campus

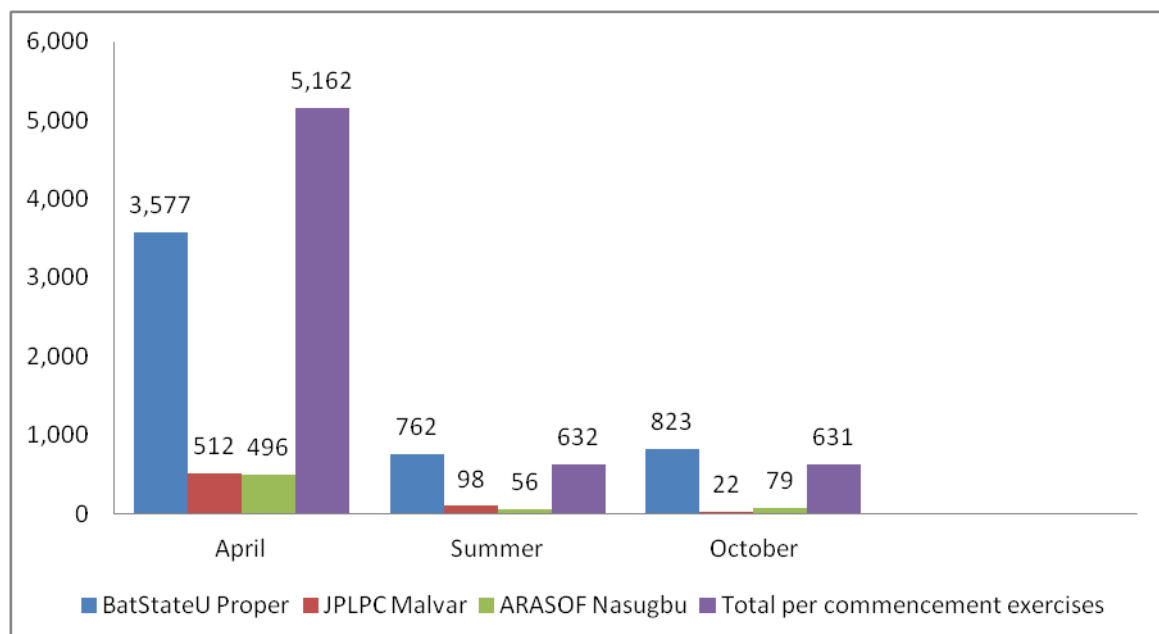


GRADUATES

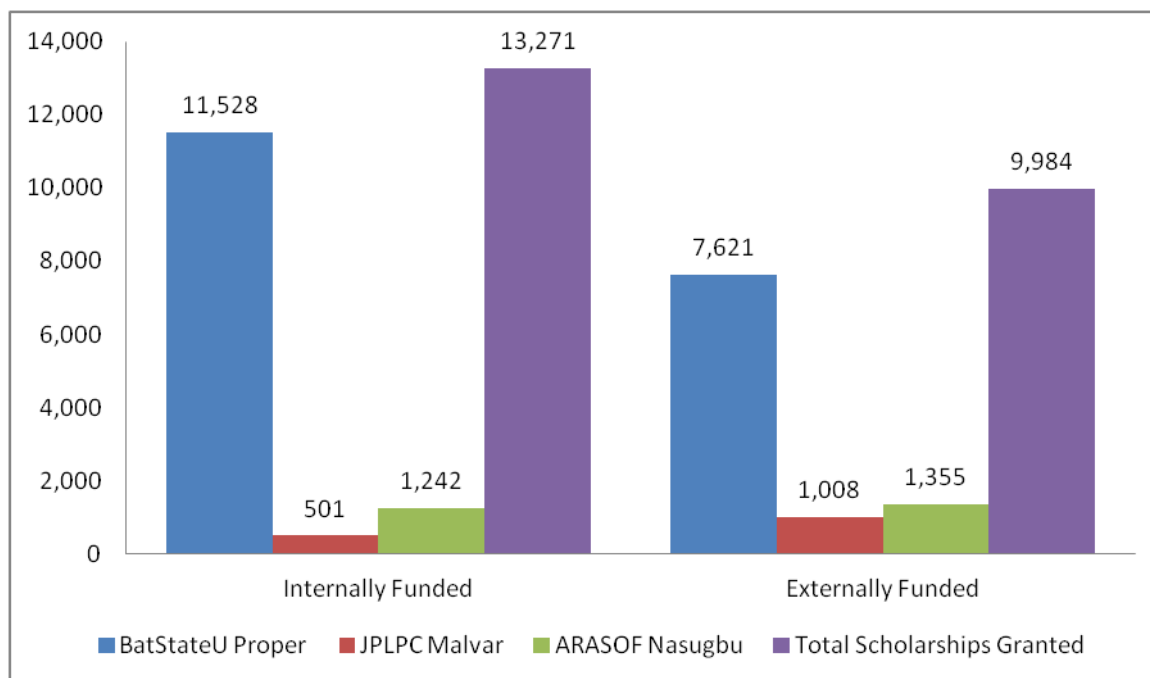

PROGRAM ACCREDITATION AND CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

PROGRAM ACCREDITATION

A total of 76 of the University's academic programs have been granted accreditation status by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP), Inc. as of December 2014. Of this number, 45 academic programs were assessed in FY 2014 alone.

This feat was recognized by the AACCUP, Inc., giving the University the second highest ranking in terms of the total number of accredited academic programs among state universities and colleges (SUCs) in 2014. BatStateU also ranked third in AACCUP, Inc.'s ranking of SUCs with the most number of programs awarded candidate status, fifth among those with most number of accredited programs in Levels I-IV, and tenth among the most number of programs awarded with Level 1 Accredited Status. 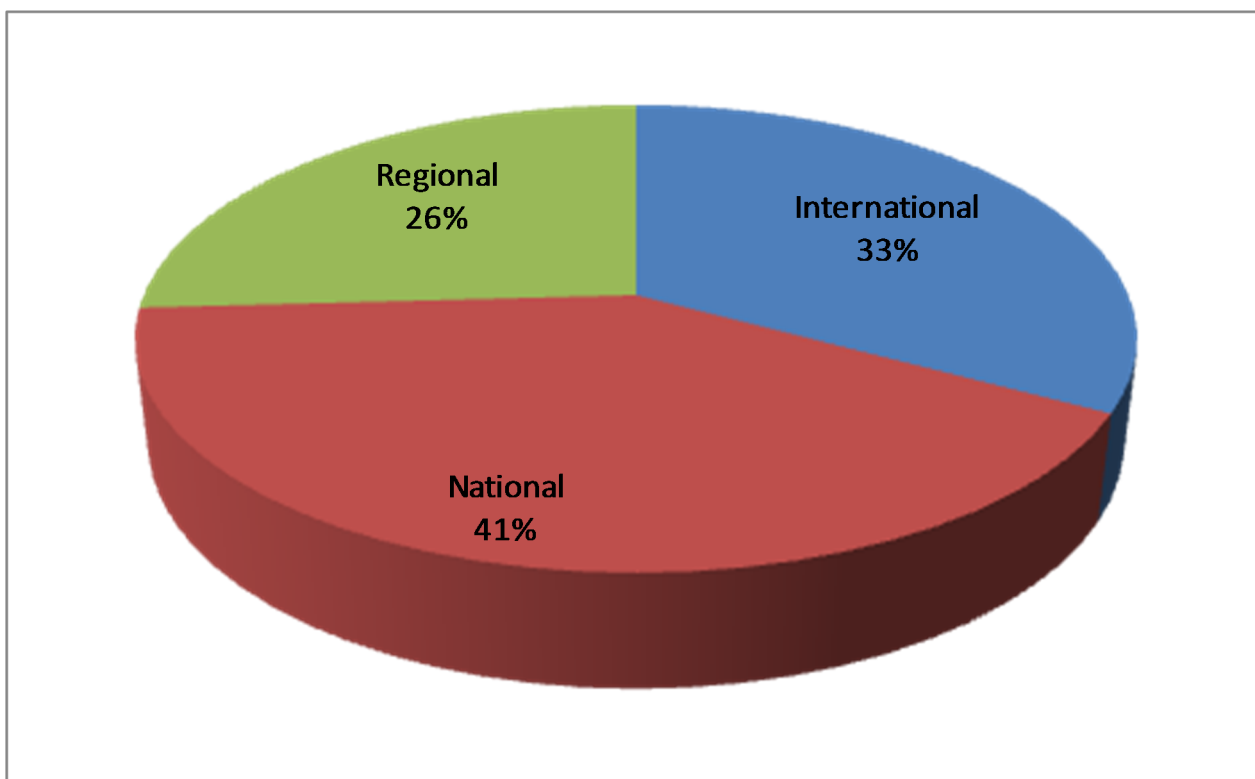


Fig. 1: Distribution of various paper presentations by category

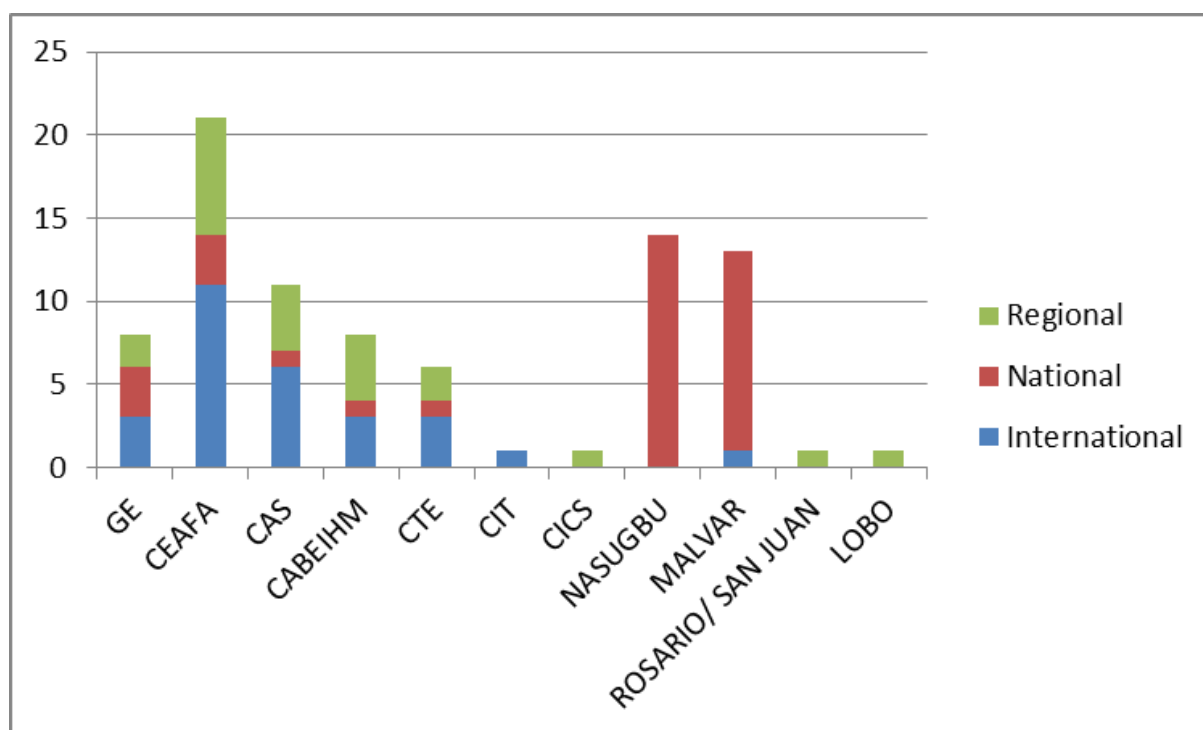


Fig. 2: Distribution of various paper presentations by College

Collectively, College of Engineering, Architecture & Fine Arts (CEAFA) – Alangilan Campus had the most papers presented in both international and regional research conferences while ARASOF-Nasugbu Campus topped the list as far as the national research conference is concerned.

In terms of presentations in international research conferences, 11 were from CEAFA; 6 from College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) – Main Campus; three each from General Engineering (GE) – Main Campus, College of Accountancy, Business, Economics and International Hospitality Management (CABEIHM) – Main Campus and College of Teacher Education (CTE) – Main Campus; 1 each from College of Industrial Technology (CIT) –

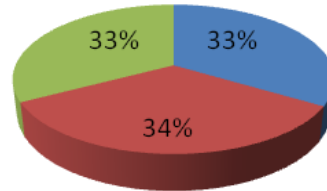

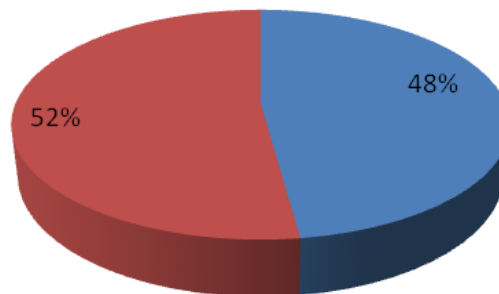

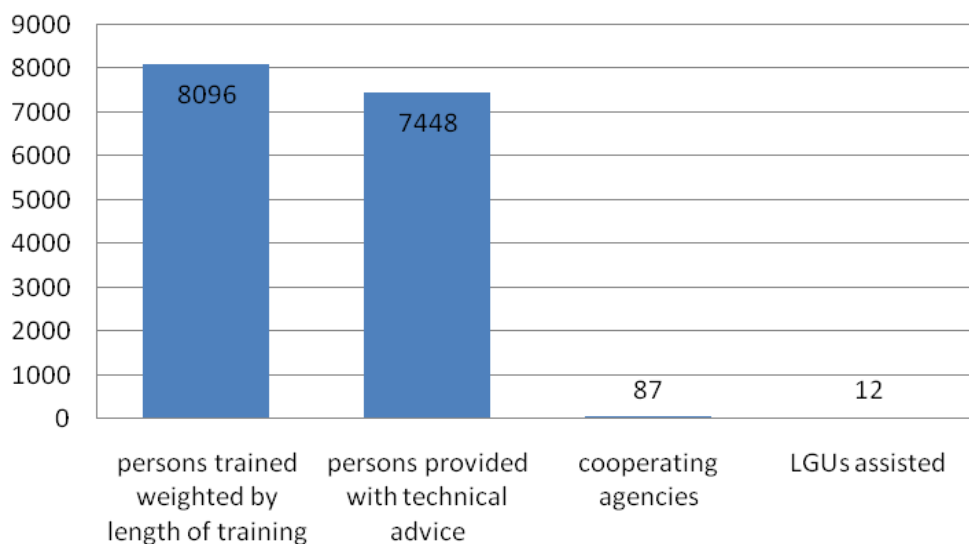

Administration and External Affairs

The Office of the Vice President for Administration and External Affairs was created through the restructuring of the Office of the Vice President for Administration and Finance and Office of the Vice President for Resource Generation and External Affairs which was approved by the Board of Regents of Batangas State University through BOR Resolution No.825 S. 2014. Under its administration are the following offices: Director for Administration Services, Director for General Services, Director for Project Management Office, Director for ICT, Director for Health Services, Director for Environmental Management Unit, Director for External Affairs, Asst. Director for Human Resource Management, Asst. Director for Records Management, Property and Supply Management and Procurement Office.

Administration Services

The **Office of the Director for Administration Services** assists in implementing laws, policies, plans, programs, rules and regulations in the area of human resource management, records management, security office, supply and property management and procurement office. As member of the Project Management Team for Strategic Performance Management System (SPMS), the PMT was able to design the University's SPMS which was approved by the BatStateU Board of Regents during its meeting on December 19, 2014 and was approved for pilot testing by the Civil Service Commission (CSC) as per their letter dated January 8, 2015.

As per directive from the University President, the Director for Administration Services designed the guidelines on the Salary Adjustment for Job Order Workers of the University. The guidelines have been approved by the Executive Committee on a meeting held last August 29, 2014 and took effect through the issuance of Memorandum dated September 1, 2014. Through the issuance of this Memorandum, salaries of Job Order Personnel have been adjusted according to their workload as per CSC Guidelines.

Furthermore, to promote camaraderie among faculty and employees, a sport activity was held which is the 3rd President's Cup. A trophy and cash amounting to Php 10,000.00 was given to the winner.

- ***Human Resource Management***

As the University aims to continue providing quality education and excellent service, it continues screening qualified applicants who will be the linking arms in achieving Batangas State University's vision, mission and goals. It plans and directs the University's recruitment and selection, hiring, managing wages and salaries, promotions, benefit administration and personnel records keeping. Recruitment and Selection is made more possible through publication, website and social media posting as means of recruitment to promote transparency in effective and responsive hiring.

Under the administration of Dr. Nora Lumbea-Magnaye until July 2014, the University was able to hire forty four (44) full-time teaching personnel, twenty four (24) part-time teaching personnel, four (4) non-teaching personnel, fifty-nine (59) job order workers, re-employed two (2) teaching personnel and one (1) non-teaching personnel.

When the new University President, Dr. Tirso A. Ronquillo assumed office, one hundred twenty-five (125) deserving faculty members and ninety-nine (99) permanent faculty members were promoted. The University also appointed Dr. Nora L. Magnaye, the former President as University Professor, nine (9) contractual and eleven (11) temporary faculty members to permanent status and seventeen (17) contractual

faculty members to temporary status. Likewise, the University was able to renew the contracts of eleven (11) casual employees and granted notice of step increment to seven (7) teaching personnel and seventeen (17) non-teaching staff to reward their consistent commitment in service pursuant to Joint Circular CSC and DBM Circular No.1, s. 2012 dated September 3, 2012.

The University granted full-time scholarship to two (2) regular faculty members and part-time scholarship to four (4) regular faculty members. Moreover, the University gave service awards to twenty-five (25) teaching and five (5) non-teaching personnel and loyalty awards to six (6) teaching and five (5) non-teaching personnel during its 111th Foundation Anniversary Celebration held at Batangas City Convention Center.

• **Supply and Property Management**

The University through its Supply and Property Management Office, headed by Mr. Mario G. Eborra maintains custody, disposition of unserviceable or no longer needed equipment of the University (e.g. motor vehicles, office equipment, furniture, etc.) consistent with government accounting rules and regulations. It is also committed in providing quality resources particularly materials and equipment.

The University issued One Million Two Hundred Twenty Six Thousand Forty Four Pesos and 72/100 (Php 1,226,044.72) worth of supplies to different departments/offices which was purchased through DBM-Procurement Service and only a little portion of it which stock was not available at DBM-PS was taken from private suppliers. Likewise, an amount of Fifty Three Million Three Hundred Forty One Thousand Fifty Five Pesos and 46/100 (Php 53,341,055.46) worth of office equipment and/or instructional materials were issued to different departments and offices for a period of six months.

• **Procurement**

The University undertakes its procurement process in accordance with the implementing guidelines of Republic Act 9184 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations. It was able to process a total of nine hundred ninety-seven (997) approved request letters/purchase requests from the various end-user units of the University and one thousand three hundred seventy four (1,374) Purchase/Job Orders and awarded to various winning suppliers. They consolidated the Project Procurement Management Plan (PPMP) of various units of the University indicating the Mode of Procurement and were posted to transparency seal.

Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Services

The University's continuous development can also be seen in its ICT infrastructure development and data integration on a university-wide basis. One of its major projects is Systems Automation and Development or the Electronic Management and Coordination Center (EMC²) wherein the university is in the process of procurement of servers, desktop computers, ICT related peripherals and supplies. The development of the control panel for its primary function is 50% complete and the Software Requirements Specifications (SRS) for all the automated and online applications integrated is 90% complete and the ICT Services staff has started the design of the whole system.

With regards to Internet Connectivity, the EMC² team has proposed the downgrade of the existing Direct Internet Access (DIA) for BatStateU Main and BatStateU Alangilan. However, since the EMC² operations would require a much significant bandwidth, the EMC² team also proposed the installation of additional DSL lines to BatStateU Main, BatStateU Alangilan, and BatStateU Lipa City. This proposal would certainly improve the access of all stakeholders to the Internet but without much additional expenses in our Internet subscription.

Currently, the TOR for students takes time to process completely. Errors during the transfer of records from printed copies frequently occur. The

staff of the Registrar's Office needs to proofread the document several times to ensure accuracy and reliability of the information printed. This makes the clients wait for several days, sometimes weeks to claim their TOR. With the implementation of this system, TOR can be processed in minutes, and the clients can claim the document readily. This is with the assumption that clients are cleared from all liabilities and accountabilities, and the document signatories are also available. To date, the system is 95% developed and we planned to fully implement the system before the academic year 2014-2015 ends.

Since the implementation of Class Schedule Manager during the first semester of academic year 2012-2013, the ICT Services Software Development Group (SDG) has made some additions and modifications to provide the academic community more opportunities to manage their operations well. A tool is added to the system to filter and reject schedule conflicts.

SDG has been designing and developing a new website for the University. This website shall showcase all information about the University. All online systems and applications locally developed will be accessible via this website. The website is 90% complete and planned to formally present the site to the Administration and Academic community by March 2015.

External Affairs

The University through the External Affairs Office continuously strives to establish new partnership with foreign Universities/agencies. As part of this venture, the University held its 1st International Conference on the Development of Local Cultural & Digital Archives with Chonbuk National University, South Korea last January 8-9, 2014. The University also welcomed the 4th batch of Exchange Students from Dongwon Middle School, South Korea which was composed of 20 Korean Students and 2 Adult Teachers. The Integrated School Department prepared a week-long activity during their stay in the University.

Last February 10, 2014, Ms. Bui Thi Ngan, Officer-in-Charge of the International Programs of Hanoi University of Industry, Socialist Republic of Vietnam and colleagues visited the University for a possible tie-up wherein students from HaUI may take both Master's and Doctoral in English at BatStateU. Likewise, the officials of Thai Nguyen University, Dr. Nguyen The Hung, Mr. Ha Quang Viet and Prof. Olivia Magpily visited the University for the evaluation of our Ph.D. in English Program last March 10, 2014.

As the Office currently work on the University's Guidelines and Policies for Foreign Students, benchmarking on the policies and tuition

fee scheme for Foreign Students at the Philippine Normal University (PNU), University of the East (UE), Far Eastern University (FEU), Southern Luzon State University (SLSU), Cavite State University (CavSU) and Polytechnic University of the Philippines (PUP) was conducted.

On March 20, 2014, the University was visited by officials from Yannarate Pattana Pittiyakom School, Thailand to benchmark the best practices of the Integrated School Department.

Ceremonial signing of Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the University and Glo Elite Academy was held last May 9, 2014 and on August 20, 2014 the Korea University of Technology and Education (KUTE) scholars made a courtesy call to evaluate KUTE and BatStateU joint scholarship project.

On September 30, 2014, a meeting with Prof. Chun Kwang Ho of Chonbuk National University (CBNU), Seung-Kwon Anh and An Han Soo of True Education Corporation for the planning of Agricultural Technology Research Center was held. Likewise, the University conducted a welcome program and orientation for the students and staff of Inje University last December 22, 2014.

Health Services

To protect and promote the health and well-being of the students, faculty members and personnel of the University, it provides services such as consultation, emergency treatment, medical and dental examinations and other related services to students and personnel. It also conduct campaign and implementation on Institution's medical and dental programs and projects, coordinate with the provincial and city health units in the integration of health programs of the University and establish monitoring and evaluation systems of existing health activities. In accordance to RA 10028 (*Expanded Breastfeeding Promotion Act of 2009*), the lactation station service was provided to breastfeeding mother, either an employee or a student of this University.

Under the management of the new Director, Dra. Leila Marfal-Manalo, a total of eight (8) nursing staffs and one (1) medical clerk were added in the department to accommodate the

increasing population of BatStateU students. Moreover, all medical needs were provided during different events or activities conducted inside and outside the University premises like BatStateU's 111th Founding Anniversary and 14th of the University STRASUC Olympics held at the University of the Philippines-Los Baños.

In partnership with the City Health Office of Batangas City, the University's clinic in Main Campus II (Alangilan) was visited by City Health Office staffs for the evaluation of the lactation facility on December 12, 2014 and needed requirements for compliance were noted for the issuance of certificate of recognition. Likewise, in cooperation with the Philippine Red Cross, health services department together with the College of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences conducted a blood donation activity which benefited individuals whom are financially incapacitated.

Environmental Management Unit (EMU)

From 1st - 4th Quarter, 2014, the University has continually complied all the legal requirements and/or conditions indicated in the Environmental Compliance Certificate. Indeed, there were no significant environmental and health effects transpired within the monitoring period covering January to December, 2014. The University's environment and its activities, within the monitoring period, has been successfully planned and managed resulting to compliance to major environmental regulations principally the RA 9275, RA 8749, RA 6969, RA 9003, and PD 1586 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations.

The University was recognized by Pollution Control Association of the Philippines for its Best Practices on Environmental Management last October 30, 2014 through the Outstanding Performance of the Pollution Control Officer.

Pursuant to RA 9275, Septic tank Sampling and Analysis, Siphoning of about 30 m³ sludge from septic tank at Main Campus I, II, and Rosario Campus, and installation of water meter at Main Campus I and II was conducted. Pursuant to RA 6969, ambient air quality test, stack emission test of generator, dislodging of selected septic tanks of Main Campus I was performed. Also, they conducted collection, treatment and disposal of

busted fluorescent lamps, expired/used laboratory chemicals and containers previously containing toxic chemicals. Likewise, pursuant to RA 9003, the collection of Recyclables, Compostable, Special, Residual, Condemnable, and disposal of residual waste was handled properly.

With regards to Information, Education and Communication, several seminars were conducted which were attended by students, janitors, maintenance employees, newly hired employees, canteen operators, and parents. The PCO attended seminars related to Environment, Health and Safety and even posted Environmental Tarpaulins and/or Safety Signages. The office has also prepared five (5) modules for orientations comprising topics on Environment, Health and Safety.

On Environment, Health and Safety, EMU has conducted inspections of the University premises for potential hazards that may cause accident to students, employees, visitors and other stakeholders of the University. The office likewise requested a budget amounting to Php 91,500.00 for the procurement of 41 units of Portable Fire Extinguisher installed at different campuses of the University.

General Services

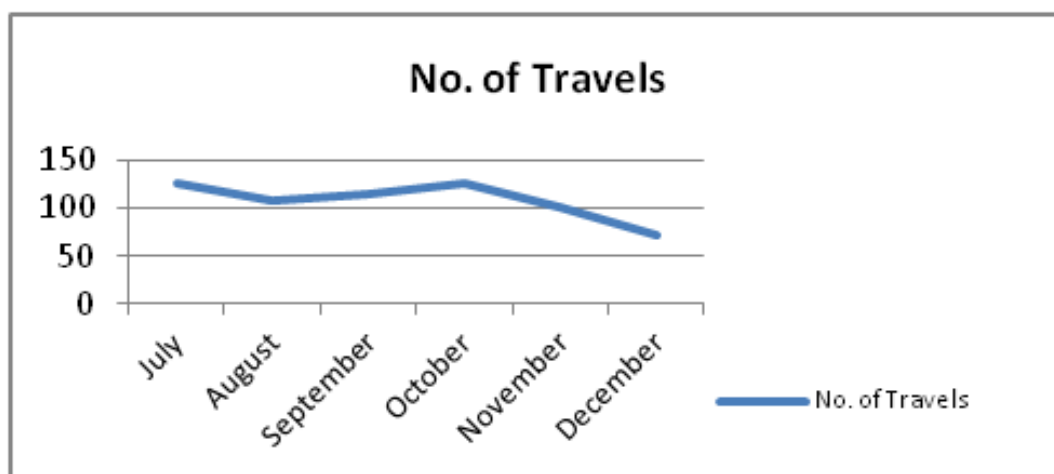
The General Services Office provides equipment, grounds and building maintenance services, as well as the management of the utilization of facilities.

The Facility Management Office in Main campus I was able to accomplish a total of 612 job order requests which include air-con tech, carpentry, electrical, masonry, painting and plumbing.

Meanwhile, the Building, Equipment and Grounds Maintenance Office in Main Campus II were able to accomplish their targets. These include the installation of new water line supply, wall faucets, flexible hoses and angle valves of cashier's office comfort room. Fabricate fifty (50) sets of drawing table, sixteen (16) units of chalk dust box for cubicle room partition and six (6) sets of new whiteboards for Chemical Engineering classrooms. Construct new wooden wall partition of IGP water refilling station and office, and, culvert and driveway of new build Ralph G. Recto Building. Repaint of Amphitheater and Audio Visual Room stage, walls and ceilings. Installation of new g.i. pipes water line supply (water district) along gate 2 pathway to CEAFA building. While some of the minor accomplishments of the office include the rehabilitation of floor tiles and leak pipes of comfort rooms, construction of wooden platform, painted twenty four (24) sets of sieves, cleaned and repaired roof gutters, repaired movable classroom partition (cubicle).

The Motorpool Unit served the different stakeholders of the university in their official travels and continuously observes carpooling to ensure the maximum utilization of university vehicles. The following were the number of official trips catered by the unit by month:

In addition, the university hostel was able to house and serve a total of 1,070 guests for the period July to December 2014. The hostel has seven (7) suite, four (4) standard and six (6) economy rooms.

In view of its perceived necessity, the GSO likewise prepared and submitted a proposed policy on the utilization of school facilities. If the policy would be approved, the approving authorities, procedure for reservation as well as the utilization rates will be clearly established.



Finance and Resource Generation

The Office of the Vice President for Finance and Resource Generation (VPFRG) has always been committed to support the instruction, research, extension, production and public service activities of the Batangas State University (BatStateU). It is achieved by providing effective and efficient fiscal leadership, safeguarding University financial assets, ensuring regulatory compliance, providing timely delivery of services to internal and external stakeholders and by engaging in resource generation programs to augment limited University funds.

During Fiscal year 2014, the University has achieved strong financial performance. This can be attributed to our continuing effort to strengthen the University's financial sustainability, intensify existing resource generation projects and ensure the University's sound financial position.

Actual income, both in the Finance and Resource Generation Divisions, has exceeded the projections, and savings of Php 325,563,074 has been recorded. In addition, the Resource Generation Office was able to strengthen the monitoring and implementation of existing IGPs. These activities of the RGO advanced improved ways to cater the needs of our students while supporting University operations through the generation of profits. Taken together, the University is of sound financial position critical to the realization of its mission and vision.

Further, the University financial transactions' compliance with the mandates of applicable laws, rules and regulations reflects the BatStateU's sound financial practices and the impact of putting into practice its core values of transparency and accountability. Timely compliance with the required reports was also an important factor for our personnel to avail of the incentives due them. In addition to incentives, the Office also promoted staff development through effective trainings. This helps ensure that our personnel are both updated with government reportorial requirements and policies not to mention their advancement as professionals. The Office also involves itself in the furtherance of quality student experience by the timely disbursement of scholarship grants thus assuring the quality of education that beneficiaries deserve.

Against the backdrop of the University's strong fiscal position, the Office of the Vice President for Finance and Resource Generation shall continue to operate guided by the Strategic Plan of the University. The Office shall exert all its efforts to meet or even surpass the accomplishments it recorded in 2014.

Our commitment to provide proficient management of fiscal resources and adopt ethical standards and integrity in all our endeavors to support University operations shall continue.

Finance Services

The Finance Services Office is primarily tasked with efficient and effective delivery of financial services to various stakeholders of the University along the areas of accounting, budgeting and cashiering; implementing and maintaining budget policies and procedures, reporting mechanism, system and records to ensure financial viability, sustainability of operation and financial management of the University resources. It is responsible for timely financial reporting to the Management, government agencies particularly the Commission on Audit (COA) and the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and all other stakeholders of the University.

Budget Office

For Fiscal Year 2014, the University received a total budget appropriation from the national government amounting to Php 390,529,463.00 with an increase of Php 60,257,109.00 or 18.24% as compared to FY 2013. The University incurred obligation for specified amounts in accordance with the legislative appropriation. These amounts are broken down as follows:

The University had registered a total income of Php 811,969,767.08 derived from collection of tuition fees and other charges, fiduciary fund and income generating projects which was Php 110,201,190.08 or 15.70% higher than the projected income. The University incurred obligation for specified amounts in accordance with the approved Program of Receipts and Expenditures (PRE) by the University Board of Regents (BOR) broken down as follows:

- Through the prudent efforts exerted by this Office, reconciliation of income versus allotment obligated in the prior years, a significant amount of Php 18,106,879.00 was determined as unbudgeted and unutilized. Said amount can be used for the unfunded projects and programs of the University for next year.
- Constant monitoring of tuition and other fees collected from students lead to a 9.5% or Php 64,352,105.68 higher actual income as of December 31, 2014 compared to actual income last year. Also noted was the remarkable excess of 2014 actual versus projected collection in the amount of Php 110,201,190.08 including IGP.
- A total of Php 14,566,689.86 was paid to the Land Bank of the Philippines representing loan amortization last January and July 2014. The amounts were promptly paid before due dates, hence the University did not incur any penalty or surcharge. The loan balance was reduced to Php 14,566,689.86 and is expected to be fully settled in 2015. Around Php 31 Million taxes withheld were remitted on time to the BIR, thus no penalties were incurred by the University.
- The University Accounting Reports have been compliant with the Philippine Public Sector Accounting Standards (PPSAS) since its effectivity on January 2014. This is in line with the mandates of PD 1445 in keeping and enhancing the information value of the accounts of the government. The PPSAS sets out recognition, measurement, presentation and disclosure requirements for financial reporting in the Philippine Government.
- The Assessment section maintained and updated around 22,000 student accounts for the Main and Alangilan Campus. Statements of Account were prepared for students who requested for their scholarship applications.
- Accounts Receivables from students as well as from canteen tenants has been reduced from previous year's Php 297,081,256.20 to Php 119,630,660.79 of this year.

Cashier's Office

- The collection of tuition, miscellaneous and other fees in the amount of Php 614.6 M for Fund 164, Php 31.2M for Regular Trust Fund and Fund and Php 61.7M for Fund 163 were deposited intact at Government Depository Bank, Land Bank of the Philippines, Batangas Branch. This is to ensure that (1) cash is managed in accordance with law and regulations and (2) the cash is safeguarded against illegal or improper disposition.
- The Cash Allocation of Php 340M released by DBM was used for payment for Personnel Services, Maintenance & Other Operating Expenses.
- The salaries of BatStateU personnel, honorarium, salary adjustments and fringe benefits for CY 2014 are paid thru ATM for easy and fast withdrawal system. This is in line with the University's aim to ensure high level of efficiency and effectiveness in its operation
- Submitted on time and accurately to Bureau of Internal Revenue, Batangas Branch the year-end Alphalist of Payees (Employees and Contractors) for taxes withheld for Calendar Year 2014.
- Monthly premiums, contribution, loan remittances and taxes withheld from University personnel were remitted to GSIS, HDMF, Philhealth and BIR within the prescribed/ reglementary period .
- To effectively manage the university resources, savings account in the amount of Php 100,000,000.00 earmarked for infrastructure projects, were opened at Development Bank of the Philippines, enabling the University to earn an interest of Php 656,877.39.
- For ease and convenience, the On-Call Facility payment of tuition and other fees is now available at Land Bank of the Philippines.

Resource Generation Office

Batangas State University is committed to serve the needs of its students, faculty and staff, and other members of the BatStateU community through identification of their needs and making these needs available for their convenience. Through the Resource Generation Office, under the administration of the Vice President for Administration and Resource Generation and was later on transferred to the administration of the Vice President for Finance and Resource Generation headed by Atty. Luzviminda C. Rosales in the second half of 2014, the University was able to carry on its mission to provide better services and University products to the community.

The Office was successful enough in providing services and products to its customers and is continually identifying the needs for their satisfaction. In 2014, the office continued most of its income generating projects and started to conceptualize other projects that benefit both the University and the community.

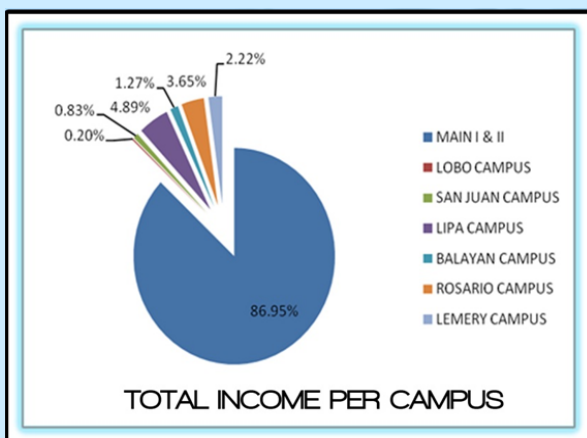
Overall, the year 2014 has registered very satisfactory performance. It had introduced many changes through policies, procedures and processes of the organization.

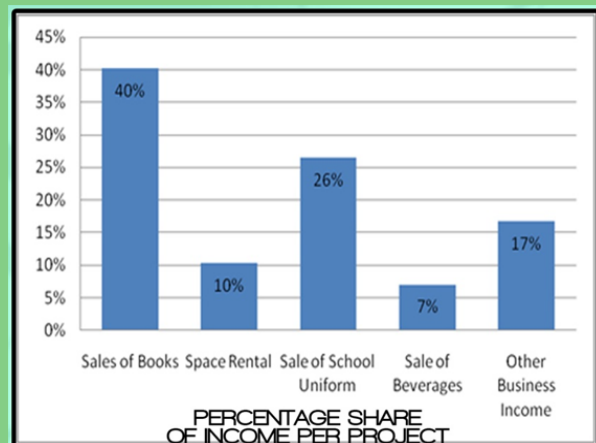

A total of Php 179,570.00 receivables current and past due from water refilling was collected.

INSURANCE

There were 35,577 students covered by Student Personal Accident Insurance. All claims were processed and paid by the Insurer through RGO.

CAPS & GOWNS

4,035 graduates were issued caps and gowns within the scheduled time. The office negotiated to retain the existing rate of caps & gown rental.

Commission from Vending Machines

24 vending machine in Main I, II, Rosario and Lipa Campuses were installed and a total rebate amounting to Php 199,928.90 was collected.

GRADUATION PICTURE & YEARBOOK

1,283 and 2,090 students voluntarily availed of yearbook and graduation pictures respectively.

DORMITORY

Dormitory operations registered an income of Php 564,522.600 during the second half of 2014. Its operation was turn-over to CABIHM later part of the year.

Financial Statement

In Fiscal Year 2014, the Batangas State University continued to improve its overall financial operations. The University ended the year with an operating surplus (excess of income over expenses) of 241.5 million.

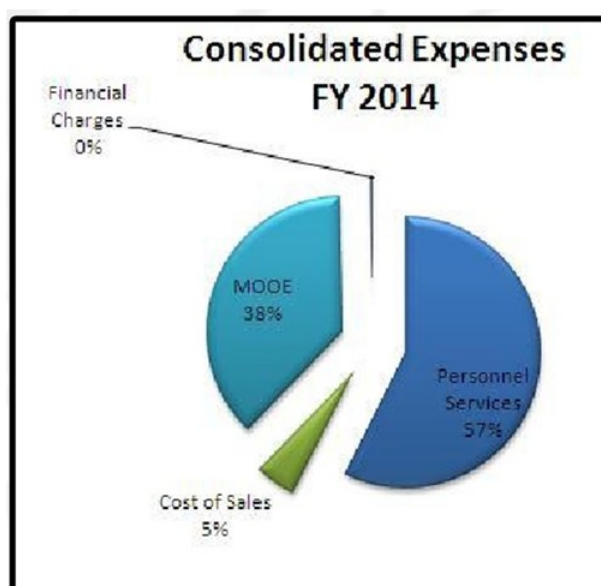
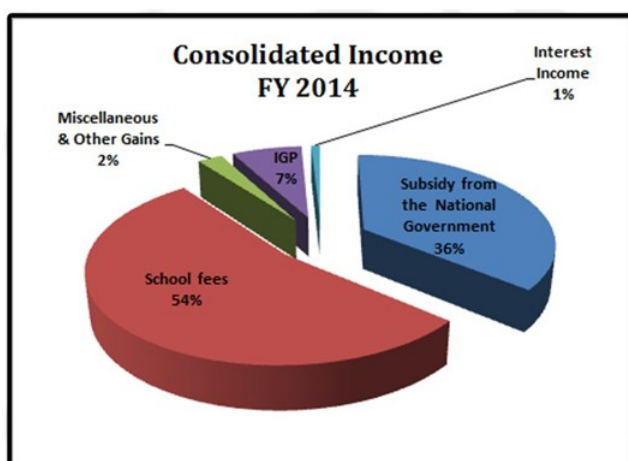

- Income from Interest Income was 8.3 million or 1% of total income.

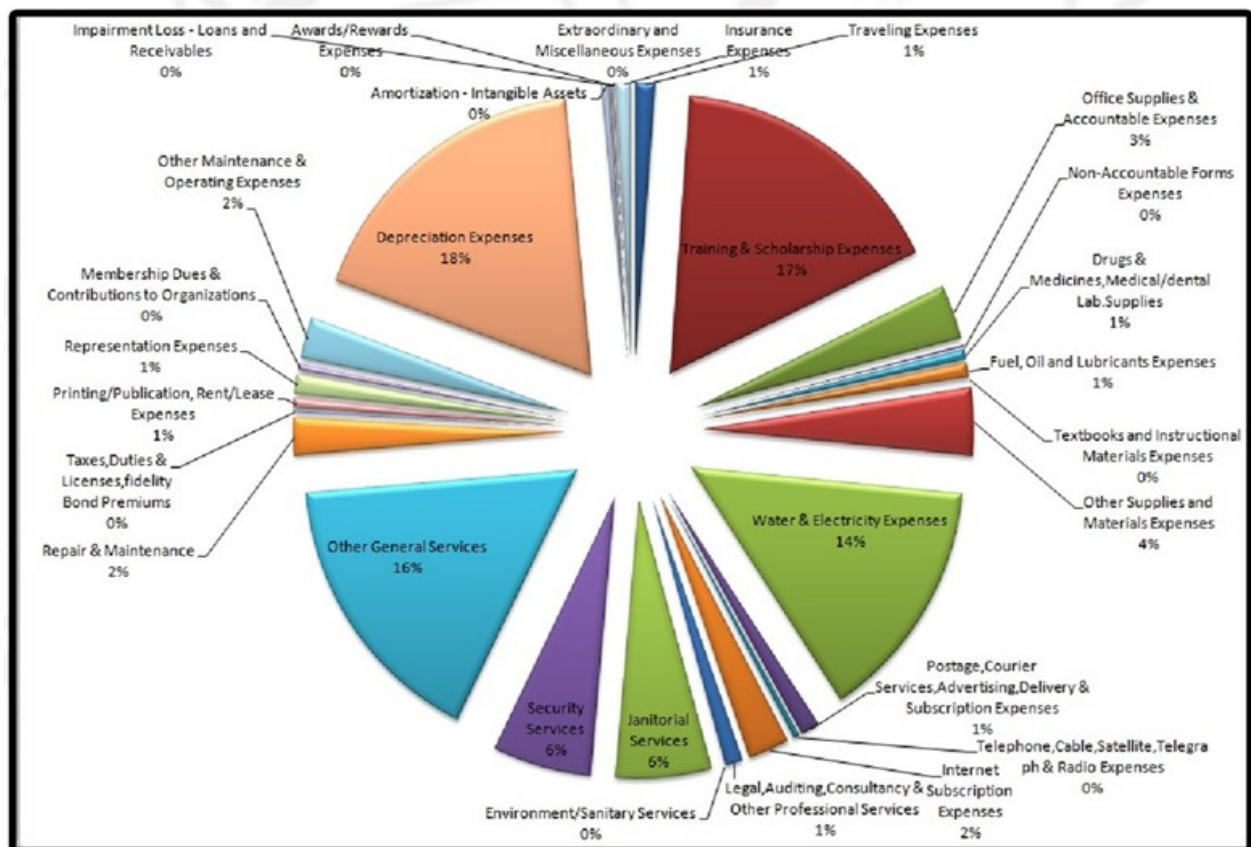
The pie charts present the composition of total operating income and total operating expenses for Fiscal Year 2014.



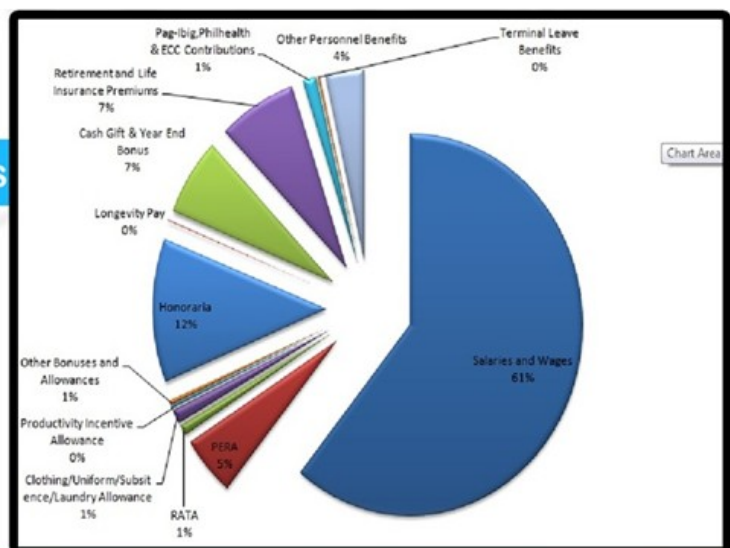

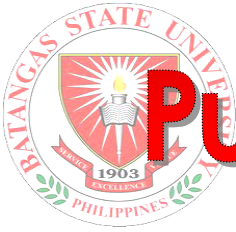

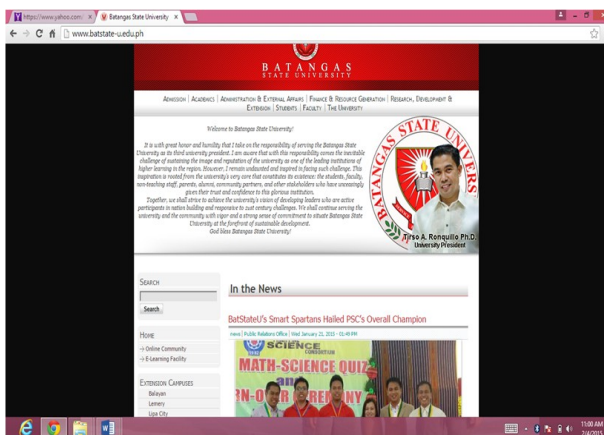

Production of the Promotional Materials for the 1st BatStateU Show

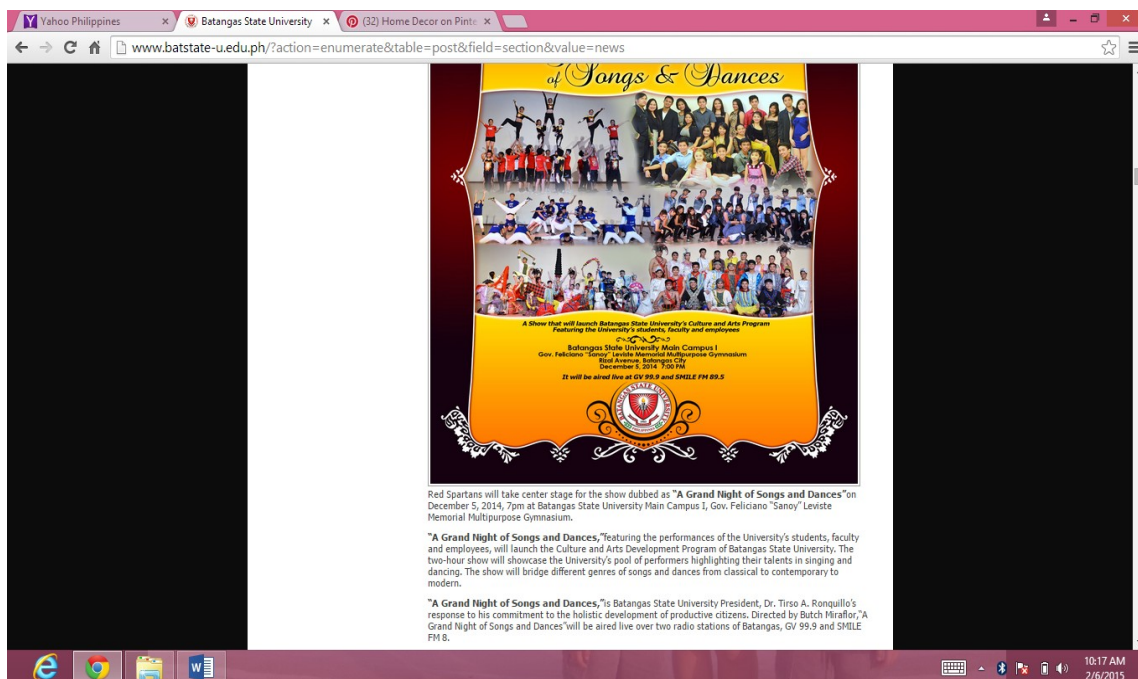
