The VIP CORALS launched a seminar on Biological Activity and Marine Biodiversity on January 18 at BatStateU Pablo Borbon Main I.

Resource speaker Assoc. Prof Armin S. Coronado, Institute for Science and Technology Research Director from Polytechnic University of the Philippines, shared some insights from his study entitled, "Biological Activities of Sulphated Polysaccharides from Brown Seaweeds and their Potential Applications in Pharmaceutical and Related Industries," and discussed the antimicrobial activity of Crude Ethanolic Extract (CEE) against Staphylococcus aureus, and the Crude Sulfated Polysaccharide (CSP) as natural anticancer compound.

Meanwhile, resource speaker Dr. Noel Saguil, Post-Doctoral Research Associate of Olivera Lab University of Utah, discussed the Biodiversity Research to Drug Development Initiatives. One of the highlights of his discussion was the Conus geographus, which is the ocean's most venomous and deadliest cone snail and its potential for curing diseases such as hormonal cancer.
