Likha Award; Regional Winner for the Outstanding Student Creative Research or Sibol Award for College students; and 1st Runner-up for the Regional Outstanding Utility Model.

Themed "Science for the People: Enabling Technologies for Sustainable Development," the event was hosted by the DOST CALABARZON and Technology Application and Promotion Institute (TAPI). RSTW is a

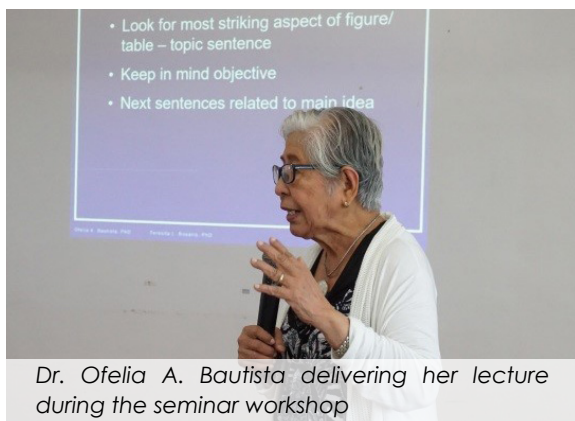


segment of the National Science Technology Week (NSTW), which is a nationwide celebration of the country's significant S&T contributions.

## RMS hosts Seminar-workshop on Journal Article Writing



The RMS hosted a seminar-workshop on Journal Article Writing on October 2-4 at BatStateU Pablo Borbon Main I.

A total of 30 faculty researchers with completed qualitative research from the different campuses of the University were the selected participants of the activity.

On day 1, VP for Research, Development, and Extension Services Engr. Albertson D. Amante discussed the current research programs of the University and the incentives given by the University for research paper presentation and publication. Shortly after, Assistant Director of RMISP Dr. Rosenda A. Bronce briefly discussed the rationale and overview of the three-day seminar-workshop.

The resource speaker for the event was Dr. Ofelia K. Bautista, former editor-in-chief of the

Philippine Agricultural Scientist International Journal and the current consulting editor of the said ISI Journal.

Dr. Bautista delivered a series of lectures in the course of three days: Writing the Introduction; Writing the Materials and Methods; Result and Discussion—Constructing; Discussion of Research Results; Title and by-line; Summary, Conclusion and Recommendation; and Abstract, Keywords, and Acknowledgement.

Other experts who served as speakers during the event were RMS Director Dr. Shirley G. Cabrera who discussed the R&D status in the Philippines and its implications; and Dr. Rosenda A. Bronce who tackled the following topics: 1) Maximizing Use of Elsevier's Tools for Research; and 2) Publication and Workshop on Selection of Journal for Publishing A Paper.
